Steve Gross addressed the concern about requester's names being provided, and confirmed there is no law in California that requires the city to hide that information

### **BACKGROUND**

At Portola Landfill, the state of California Regional Water Quality Control Board requires the city to collect samples of groundwater from wells surrounding the site, submit the samples for laboratory testing and report the results to the state agency. Since 1993, I have been involved in the groundwater monitoring program at the landfill. Groundwater samples have been collected from the eight monitoring wells installed around the landfill footprint and three domestic water wells from nearby residences on Sunset Drive. The samples have been sent to a laboratory in Bakersfield, CA for testing. When the testing was completed, we prepare a report (which is certified as true and correct under my registered civil engineer license) to send to the RWQCB in Redding. Currently, collection of samples and laboratory testing is performed on a quarterly basis and reporting on a semi-annual basis. The groundwater monitoring program is mandated to the city under Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R5-2015-0083.

Groundwater sample collection has been performed the past 20-plus years by Patrick Flynn of Sierra Environmental of Quincy. Mr. Flynn has recently moved away from California and will not be able to continue the sample collection. I am closing in on full retirement from solid waste consulting. Accordingly, it is an appropriate time to contract with a new consultant to perform the groundwater monitoring program at Portola Landfill.

### REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

On July 6, 2022 the city issued a request for proposal for Portola Landfill groundwater monitoring services (see attached). The RFP specified that responding firms must have relevant experience in environmental groundwater monitoring, collect and submit groundwater samples to a state of California certified laboratory, and prepare and certify reports on the lab test results, all in accordance with the WDR Order. Proposing firms were required to provide total not-to-exceed costs over a five-year period (20 calendar quarters) commencing the third quarter 2022 through the second quarter 2027.

We issued seven RFP's. Six qualified companies submitted proposals by the August 3, 2022 deadline. The companies and the total cost estimate for each over five years are:

The lowest cost proposing company is McGinley & Associates. A copy of their proposal is attached.

Review of McGinley's proposal shows they have the requisite experience and expertise to perform Portola Landfill groundwater monitoring services in accordance with the Waste Discharge Requirements Order issued by the state RWQCB. The company has dedicated staff and equipment to collect the groundwater samples and conduct required field testing and recordkeeping. The proposed California state certified laboratory is Western Environmental Testing Laboratory of Sparks, NV. Ms. Caitlin Jelle, Director of McGinley & Associates, is a California Register Civil Engineer who would supervise the monitoring program and certify the semi-annual reports as true and correct.

### RECOMMENDATION

It is staff's opinion that McGinley & Associates is qualified to perform groundwater monitoring services at Portola Landfill. As the lowest total cost responding company, staff respectfully requests the City Council authorize contract negotiations with McGinley & Associates.

With successful contract negotiations, staff will return to the City Council at a future meeting with a recommendation to execute a contract with McGinley & Associates for a five-year period.

# 3. KEY PERSONNEL'S QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

# 3.1 Project Management

The McGinley personnel to be assigned to the Mono County Landfill Groundwater Sampling and Reporting Services have the requisite technical capabilities and project experience to perform all aspects of sampling, data interpretation and, report preparation.

# 3.2 Field Personnel

Our proposed primary field Technician to conduct the groundwater sampling activities is Mr. Matt Timko. Mr. Timko has been the primary groundwater sampler for McGinley for more than three years and is responsible for the sampling at other landfill compliance projects. Field Technician support will be provided by Messrs. Domonic Whalen and Andrew Tkatch. This combined crew represents over 25 years of groundwater sampling experience.

# 4. PROJECT METHODOLOGY

Groundwater sampling activities will be conducted in accordance with all provisions stated in the applicable Waste Discharge Requirements issued by the Regional Water Board and the RFP issued by the City of Portola . Our proposed project methodology will include the following scope of services.

### 4.1 Pre-Field Activities

Prior to commencing with field activities a minimum of five business day notice will be provided to the appropriate City of Portola personnel and private homeowners of our intent to sample and/or gauge groundwater levels. We will coordinate with City personnel to gain site access and contact information for domestic well owners. A site-specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP) will be prepared and reviewed by all relevant personnel prior to commencing with field activities.

# 4.2 Groundwater Sample Collection

Groundwater samples will be collect as outlined in the following sections. All field data will be recorded on the groundwater sample log provided in Attachment A and/or one provided by the City of Portola.

# 4.2.1 Gauging

Prior to groundwater sample collection the groundwater level in each well will be gauged using an electronic water level meter with a resolution of 0.01 feet. The meter will be decontaminated with

an Alconox/distilled water solution after use at each well. Water level measurements will be recorded on the field log.

# 4.2.2 Purging

Each well will be purged until field monitoring parameters stabilize and at least three casing volumes of water have been removed. Field parameters to be measured include depth to groundwater, pH, conductivity, temperature and turbidity. Stabilization of field parameters is considered complete when successive measurements of temperature are within 1 °C, pH is within 0.10, and electrical conductance is within 10 percent. Downhole equipment will be decontaminated with a distilled water/Alconox solution after use at each well. Wastewater generated during groundwater sampling will be discharged to ground surface unless otherwise noted.

# 4.2.3 Groundwater Sampling

Groundwater samples will be collected using a disposable polyethylene bailer. A new bailer will be used at each sample location. The groundwater sample will be placed in labeled laboratory-provided glass sample containers, preserved as necessary, and placed on ice in a cooler pending delivery to the laboratory for analysis. An equipment blank will be collected during each sampling event by collecting deionized water that has been run over decontaminated field equipment. This will provide quality control for decontamination procedures.

# 4.2.4 Domestic Well Sampling

Domestic well sampling will be conducted at three wells each quarter. To collect the sample, water will be run through the exterior faucet for approximately five minutes and then field parameters will be collected (less groundwater levels). A sample will be collected directly from the faucet in labeled laboratory-provided glass sample containers, preserved as necessary, and placed on ice in a cooler pending delivery to the laboratory for analysis

# 4.2.5 Analytical Testing

Groundwater samples will be delivered to WETLAB in Sparks, Nevada under chain-of-custody protocol for analytical testing. The following table shows the analyses to be conducted by the lab based on the type of well (i.e., domestic and monitoring). Each sample shipment will include a travel blank. The laboratory will provide test results for each sample collected along with internal QC documentation and an EDF for uploading to the California Geotracker database.

# 4.3 Landfill Inspection and Observation

Landfill inspections will be conducted twice per year by McGinley staff under the oversight of a PE. The inspection will include a site visit to observe the conditions of the landfill's environmental control features including the final cover, surface drainage systems, and the storm water basins. Follow up actions to correct any deficiencies notes will be provided to the City immediately.

# 4.4 Report Preparation

McGinley will prepare semi-annual and annual reports for the landfill consistent with the requirement of the waste discharge requirements and standards of the Regional Board. The semi-annual reports are due to the Regional Board by August 1st, as such, a draft of each report will be submitted to the City for review by July 15th of each year. The annual reports are due to the Regional Board by February 1st, as such, a draft of each report will be submitted to the county by January 15th of each year.

The reports will include the following:

- a discussion of the landfills compliance with the WDR order,
- a summary of landfill inspections and observations,
- descriptions of groundwater sampling and handling procedures,
- groundwater elevations and supporting hydrographs and figures depicting flow velocity and direction,
- a discussion of laboratory results and supporting tables, time series plots, a Stiff diagram, and
- a discussion of any issues noted during sampling.

All reports will be reviewed and certified by a California licensed civil engineer (PE).

# 5. PROPOSED FEES

In accordance with the RFP, not to exceed costs have been broken out by quarter and/or semi-annual as appropriate. A summary of these costs are provided below. A fee schedule and breakdown of the costs are provided in Attachment B.

Professional fees shall be evaluated every two years, with an increase of up to 3%per evaluation

period, consistent with current economic conditions. Additionally, McGinley will annually collect competitive bids for analytical services and costs for those services will be updated accordingly.

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### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Independent Contractor Agreement ("Agreement") is made and executed in Portola, California this 27th day of January 2021, by and between the City of Portola (hereinafter referred to as "the CITY"), and Susan Scarlett (hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR"). The CITY desires to contract with CONTRACTOR, a qualified business or person, to provide the services listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein (hereinafter referred to as "SERVICES").

In consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, it is agreed:

- 1. Independent Contractor. It is understood and agreed, that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor, and not the employee, agent, joint venture, or partner of the CITY, for any purpose whatsoever. The CITY, shall have no right to, and shall not control the manner or prescribe the method by which the SERVICES are performed by CONTRACTOR hereunder. CONTRACTOR shall be entirely and solely responsible for its acts and acts of its agents, employees, and subcontractors while engaged in the performance of SERVICES hereunder.
- 2. Compensation. Subject to adjustments as provided in section 2.5 CONTRACTOR will be compensated at the rate of \$5,000 per month and for out of County travel and other expenses as agreed upon between the parties for an average of 20 work hours per week. The CITY shall make payment to CONTRACTOR by the 30<sup>th</sup> day of each month for work performed in that month.
- 2.5 Adjustments to Compensation. In the event that CONTRACTOR's duties are substantially increased the CITY and CONTRACTOR shall negotiate in good faith concerning an adjustment in compensation to reflect CONTRACTOR's additional duties.
- Equipment and Office. The CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain all customary and necessary equipment, supplies, maintenance and utilities required for the SERVICES.
- 4. Quality Assurance. CONTRACTOR shall provide the SERVICES in accordance with the professional standards applicable to the financial and/or accounting services provided and in a manner that is acceptable to the CITY. CONTRACTOR shall meet with the City Manager as requested to review quality assurance procedures, quality standards or quality concerns. CONTRACTOR shall immediately address any quality of performance issues and timely report to the City Manager the status of such issues. Any completed SERVICE will not be accepted until approved by the City Manager.
- 5. Term and Termination. The term of this Agreement shall be for three years beginning on the date this Agreement is approved by the City Counsel. This Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause, by giving 90 days written notice as provided in Paragraph 19 of this Agreement; provided that the City may only terminate this Agreement upon

the vote of at least three City Council members and the written recommendation of the City Manager.

- 6. Taxes. CONTRACTOR agrees and understands that as an independent contractor, CONTRACTOR is responsible for the payment of all self-employment taxes, and other taxes which may arise as a result of it performing SERVICES as an independent contractor. It is further understood that the CITY shall have no responsibility in withholding any taxes payable to the federal or state government, and that it is CONTRACTOR's sole responsibility to meet its tax obligations.
- 7. Insurance. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for furnishing and maintaining, at CONTRACTOR's own expense, Professional Errors and Omissions, Automobile and Worker's Compensation insurance for CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR's employees while engaged in the performance of SERVICES hereunder.
- 8. Rules, Regulations and Laws. CONTRACTOR agrees and understands that it shall comply with all of the CITY's rules and regulations and all applicable federal, state, local, and professional laws, ordinances and regulations while engaged in the performance of SERVICES hereunder.
- 9. Licenses and Permits. CONTRACTOR agrees that as a condition of this Agreement it shall have and maintain all required professional or other licenses and business permits, when applicable, when engaged in the performance of SERVICES hereunder.
- CONTRACTOR agrees that all PROPRIETARY Proprietary Rights. CONTRACTOR shall treat all PROPRIETARY INFORMATION as confidential and refrain from improper disclosure of such information. On request and at the CITY's expense, CONTRACTOR agrees to help the CITY obtain patents, trademarks and copyrights for any new developments or intellectual property. This includes providing specimens, data, plans, specifications, descriptions, documentation, and other information, as well as assisting the CITY in completing any required application or registration. Immediately upon termination or expiration of this Agreement or upon a request by the CITY, CONTRACTOR shall provide all PROPRIETARY INFORMATION to the CITY at the location designated by the CITY. CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to final payment under this Agreement until all PROPRIETARY INFORMATION is in the possession of the CITY.
- 11. Records. CONTRACTOR shall keep complete and accurate records related to the performance of the SERVICES. The CITY shall have the right to review and inspect such records during normal business hours upon reasonable notice to CONTRACTOR.

CONTARCTOR shall provide all such records, including all PROPRIETARY INFORMATION, to CITY upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall provide direction and authority to appropriate persons to provide the CITY with all records related to the performance of the SERVICES, including all PROPRIETARY INFORMATION, in CONTRACTOR'S absence or inability to respond.

- 12. Hold-Harmless Agreement. CONTRACTOR is solely liable for all claims, liabilities, damages, and debts of any type whatsoever that may arise on account of CONTRACTOR's activities, or those of CONTRACTOR's employees, agents or subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall exonerate, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the CITY, and any director or employee of the CITY for any loss, damage, liability, or claim paid or incurred by the CITY, director, or employee by reason of liability resulting from CONTRACTOR's performance of the SERVICES hereunder, or from the acts or omissions of CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR's employees, agents or subcontractors including without limitations, all consequential damages, attorney's fees and costs.
- 13. Mediation and Arbitration Clause. In the event of disagreement or dispute between the parties arising out of or connected with this Agreement which cannot be adjusted by and between the parties involved, the disputed matter shall be resolved as follows:
  - A. Mediation. The parties agree to mediate any dispute or claim arising between them out of this contract or any resulting transaction before resorting to arbitration or court action. Mediation fees, if any, shall be divided equally among the parties involved. If any party commences an arbitration or court action based on a dispute or claim to which this paragraph applies without first attempting to resolve the matter through mediation, then that party shall not be entitled to recover attorney's fees, even if they would otherwise be available to that party in any such arbitration or court action.
  - B. Arbitration. The Parties agree that any dispute or claim in law or equity arising between them out of this Agreement or any resulting transaction, which is not settled through mediation, shall be decided by neutral, binding arbitration and not by court action. The arbitration shall be conducted by a retired judge or justice, unless the parties mutually agree to a different arbitrator, who shall render an award in accordance with substantive California law. In all other respects, the arbitration shall be conducted by a retired judge or justice, unless the parties mutually agree to a different arbitrator, who shall render an award in accordance with substantive California law. In all other respects, the arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with Part III, Title 9 of the California Code of Civil Procedure. Judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. The parties shall have the right to discovery in accordance with Code of Civil Procedure §1283.05.
- 14. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

- Forum. Any mediation, arbitration or litigation to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement or the parties' rights and liabilities arising out of this Agreement or the performance hereunder shall be maintained only in the County of Plumas, California.
- 16. Attorney's Fees. In the event of any arbitration or litigation to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement or the parties' rights and liabilities arising out of this Agreement or the performance hereunder, the prevailing party in such arbitration or litigation shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs as fixed by the court.
- Severability. If any provision of the Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless continue in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 18. Integration. This Agreement terminates and supersedes the Independent Contractor Agreement between the parties dated February 14th, 2018, and contains the entire agreement among the parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous oral and written agreements, understandings, and representations among the parties. No amendments to this Agreement shall be binding unless executed in writing by all of the parties.
- Waiver. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed, or shall constitute a waiver of any other provision, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.
- Notices. Any notice required by this Agreement shall be effective only if sent by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, as follows:

For the purposes of determining compliance with any time limit in this Agreement, a notice shall be deemed to have been duly given on the second business day after mailing, if mailed to the party to whom notice is to be given in the manner provided in this Section. Either party may, at any time, change its address designated above by giving to the other party thirty-(30) days' written notice of the new address to be used for the purposes of this Section.

Assignability. Neither this Agreement nor any duties or obligations hereunder shall be assignable by any party hereto without the prior written consent of the other parties.
